Coordination of Collaboration as a Service

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Services available on the Internet roughly fall into two groups: information services, such as web pages, and collaboration services, such as text chat and voice systems. Information services are sometimes "mashed up" to provide information customized to a user's needs. Not much has been done to mashup collaboration services.

We discuss the problems that arise when coordinating collaborative services into sessions. How can users easily make applications available as services for collaboration? How can a session be easily composed and started? How can it be monitored so that failure of a service is noticed and corrective action is taken? How can we ensure the necessary network capacity is available?

We will present the SAVOIR system currently under development by NRC and partners.
